
Last Post Reminders in NZ

New Chief of Defence Force welcomes his appointment

MAJ GEN Rhys Jones, who will take up his role as Chief of Defence Force in January 2011. 6 December 2010

The new Chief of the New Zealand Defence Force, Major General Rhys Jones says he's looking forward to the challenges his new role will bring.

"With the release of the White Paper the New Zealand Defence Force has an opportunity to transform itself

into a force shaped for the next 25 years and more. With such a great organisation and such talented and dynamic people we will succeed."

MAJ GEN Jones thanked the Prime Minister, Minister of Defence and Cabinet for giving him this opportunity and paid tribute to his family who have helped him throughout his career.

"My wife and children have had to live with the stresses and strains of being a military family; the constant moves and long periods of me being away during critical times in their lives."

He has also thanked the current CDF, Lieutenant General Jerry Mateparae and his colleagues, past and present in the Defence Force, for their assistance.

"These are the people who gave me the professional knowledge and experience to be where I am today and who recognised a faint glimmer of ability and took it upon themselves to teach and support me.

Lieutenant General Jerry Mateparae has passed on his congratulations.

"MAJ GEN Jones has shown exceptional leadership qualities throughout his distinguished career with the New Zealand Army. Most recently as Chief of Army he has been a leading figure on the Defence Force's Executive Leadership Team (ELT).

Through the Government's Defence White Paper the Defence Force is entering a new era where we are being encouraged to redistribute our resources from the 'middle' and 'back' to enhance our frontline capabilities. Meanwhile, we must continue to deliver in the operational space, and be ready for the next challenge. I know MAJ GEN Jones is focused on the opportunities and challenges facing the Defence Force and is

committed to ensuring we are a strong, vibrant and professional Force, now and into the future. "

MAJ GEN Jones will officially take up this position on January 24.

BIOGRAPHY: MAJOR GENERAL R.R. (RHYS) JONES

Major General Richard Rhys Jones was born in Timaru, New Zealand on 2 May 1960. He was educated at Wanganui Boy's College and attained University Entrance.

Major General Jones enlisted into the New Zealand Army in December 1978 and attended the Royal Military College, Duntroon Australia from 1979 to 1982. He graduated into the Royal New Zealand Armoured Corps at the rank of Lieutenant in December 1982, with a Bachelor of Arts degree. During his career he has attended staff college at Fort Leavenworth, USA, and higher defence college at the Australian Defence College. He has also attained a Master of Arts in Strategic Studies from La Trobe University (Melbourne) as well as a Diploma in Qualitative Futures.

His staff appointments have been mainly within the Capability Development area, culminating in his appointment as the head of the NZDF Development Branch.

Major General Jones has held a variety of training posts. In 1987/88 he was the New Zealand Instructor at the Australian Defence Force Academy (Officer Cadets). From 1992 to 1995 he was an instructor at New Zealand's Tactical School, becoming the Chief Instructor for his last 18 months. He has also been Chief Instructor at the School of Armour and has been the New Zealand Directing Staff at the Centre for Defence and Strategic Studies, part of the Australian Defence College.

Major General Jones has had operational duty in the Middle East with the United Nations Truce Supervision Organisation, as an observer, then Operations Officer with the Observer Group Lebanon.

Major General Jones has commanded at every senior level. He was the Commanding Officer of New Zealand's armoured regiment; Queen Alexandra's Mounted Rifles (QAMR), and at Formation level the Commander 3rd Land Force Group based in the South Island of New Zealand. He was Land Component Commander within Headquarters Joint Forces New Zealand, and then in October 2007 Major General Jones became the Commander Joint Forces New Zealand on promotion to Major General. He was appointed the Chief of Army on 1 May 2009.

Major General Jones is married to Debbie and they have three children. His hobbies include reading history, war gaming and black powder shooting.

Latest information on the NZDSM medal project

21 December 2010

The tender process for production of the medal has been completed. The successful tenderer will be announced next year after the contract has been finalised and signed.

The first stage of the application process is expected to open in late February/early March. Medals will be issued based on the age of the living ex-Service person. The medals will be sent to the oldest applicants first and to those of any age who are terminally ill. To assist NZDF in ensuring the oldest applicants receive their medals first, it is expected that the initial call will be made for applications from ex-Service personnel over seventy years of age. Any applications received from persons under that age will not be processed and persons should wait until the NZDF advises that the next age group should send in their applications.

This is also the case for those applying of behalf of deceased spouses, next of kin etc.

Hiring of additional staff to work on the NZDSM project at Trentham Military Camp will begin in February 2011.

An initial NZDSM presentation will be made to a selected group of ex-Service personnel at a ceremony in Parliament in the first half of 2011. For logistical reasons it is anticipated that the majority of these personnel will be drawn from the Wellington area.

"The continuing patience of ex-Service persons and their families is acknowledged and sincerely appreciated," said Commodore Kevin Keat. "NZDF is making excellent progress on its preparations for issuing more than 100,000 NZDSMs. It is worth noting that NZDF has set itself a challenging target of less than six months to be ready to issue the NZDSM. This is less than half the 12 months required by NZDF in 2001-2002 to prepare itself for the issue of (only) 12,000 New Zealand Operational Service Medals."

For further information please read the NZDSM FAQ sheet which is being updated regularly basis in line with questions received through the medals site.

Once the application process opens the Medals Office aim to

deliver medals to those entitled to receive them as quickly as possible and will be providing frequent updates about the NZDSM Project on the Breaking News page of our website and on the FAQs about the NZ Defence Service Medal page.

Mighty warship open to public

HMNZS TE KAHA during a Fleet Entry into Auckland Harbour (MC 10-0076-006) 1 December 2010



The Anzac Frigate HMNZS TE KAHA will be in Timaru from 3 to 6 December 2010.

TE KAHA has spent a month participating in exercises off Eastern Australia working alongside HMA ships DARWIN, BALLARAT AND STUART.

While in Timaru, the ship will be open to the public.

What: HMNZS TE KAHA will be open to the public.

When: Saturday, 4 December 2010.

Time: The ship will open at 11:00am and last visitors at 2:30pm. Where: The ship will be berthed at No1 Wharf, Port of Timaru.

The first of the Royal New Zealand Navy's (RNZN) ANZAC class frigates, TE KAHA was launched in Melbourne on 22 July 1995, and commissioned in Auckland exactly two years later.

TE KAHA's assets include weaponry, radars, sonar and electronic monitoring systems. The combined diesel or gas turbine propulsion system gives her both long range endurance and high speed capability when needed.

The SH-2G (NZ) Seasprite helicopters presently operate from TE MANA and TE KAHA, embarked with aircrew from the RNZN and maintainers from the RNZAF. By 2007 they will

also operate off the two new Offshore Patrol Vessels and the Multi Role Vessel.

TE KAHA is built to the German MEKO 200 Class design. Sections of the ship were built separately (some in New Zealand) and then combined to produce the final product. There are now ten in the ANZAC class, eight Australian and two New Zealand ships.

Queens's medal awarded to Army Top shot

The Queen's Medal was awarded to the NZ Army's 'top shot' at Waiouru yesterday.

Corporal Timothy Bryce from 1st Battalion, Royal New Zealand Infantry Regiment in Linton won the competition by one shot in a fiercely contested match.

Sixty of the NZ Army's top marksman started the two day Queens Medal competition in Waiouru. The competition was broken into four elimination matches and saw shooters whittled down to ten for the final match up. Targets were engaged from 300 metres to 50 metres during the 45 minute long final.

Chief of Army Major General Rhys Jones attended the final match and presented the Queens Medal to Corporal Bryce at the prize giving last night.

"Shooting is a core skill within the Army and the standard shown during the Queen's Medal competition has been impressive. The ability for soldiers to apply good marksmanship principals is important as it allows soldiers deployed on operations to protect themselves and those they are protecting effectively," said Major General Jones.

"It was a tough competition and for Corporal Bryce to win by only one shot showed how close many of the competitors were in their skill levels," said Major Eugene Whakahoehoe, Chief Instructor of Combat School and officer in charge of the competition.

Corporal Bryce will hold the title of Champion Army shot until the next Queen's Medal competition.

The King's Medal (now The Queen's Medal) was introduced to New Zealand by King George V in 1923. Awarded to the Champion Army Shot, The Queen's Medal is contested annually. Open to all branches of the New Zealand Army, The Queen's Medal matches are fired in daylight only, firing the current in-service Steyr rifle.

With over 5000 flying hours under his belt, 10 years flying Sioux and Iroquois helicopters and five years flying fixed wing training aircraft, Wing Commander Shaun Clark stepped into his new role as Commanding Officer (CO) of Number 3 Squadron with a change of command parade at Royal New Zealand Air Force (RNZAF) Base Ohakea on 8 December.

The former student of Central Southland College is now in charge of the Air Force's rotary wing fleet, together with the personnel who fly and maintain them. No. 3 Squadron RNZAF provides operational support and training for the NZ Army. It also undertakes search and rescue missions, medical evacuation, and support to other government agencies such as the New Zealand Police and Department of Conservation.

A former leader of the Red Checkers aerobatics team, during their 2008 season, and more recently the CO of the Helicopter Transition Unit - which is responsible for introducing the new A109LUH and NH90 helicopters into service - 37-year-old WGCDR Clark says he is looking forward to returning to No. 3 Squadron.

"The role 3 Squadron performs is an important one and the flying is often exciting and challenging. Best of all, the Squadron is manned by a great team of professional aviators, maintenance and support personnel who are passionate about the Squadron and work hard to deliver military air operations for New Zealand.

"I'm very much looking forward to being a part of 3 Squadron again, and leading such a great team of people!" said WGCDR Clark.

As the Squadron prepares to gradually phase out the Sioux and Iroquois the new CO, who has previously deployed to Antarctica, Bougainville, Timor Leste and the Solomon Islands, is ready for his latest challenge.
