Veterans are reminded that every year we sell badges at the Martin Place station over two days in order to generate revenue for our ongoing operational activities. Martin Place station provides an



#### Reminder: ANZAC Day - Sunday 25th April 2010



ANZAC Day in 2010 will more than likely be the same format as this and previous years. However, just to clarify, the term 'veteran' in today's context refers to all serving and exservice personnel not just

those that served overseas. So whether you have a medal or not, as long as you served in the military you are considered a veteran and I would be very privileged to march alongside you at ANZAC Day every year. Furthermore, I will be more 'pushy' this year so please form up early, be smartly dressed and stand proudly in your ranks and files. The ANZAC Day March structure is shown below.

The vehicle has been placed at the rear of the marchers due to the exhaust fumes causing problems in previous years and WWII veterans (declining in numbers) are to be given pride of place at the front.

Also please note that Sir Ian Turbott Kt., AO., CMG., CVO., CStJ., FRSA., FAIM., FAICD., Hon.D.Litt (UWS) a NZ World War II Veteran has accepted our offer to be the Parade Commander.

Sir Ian Turbott was a New Zealand Veteran that served in the NZ Expeditionary Force from 1940 to 1946. He saw active service in the Solomon Islands, the Middle East and Italy, for which he was decorated. He then entered the Colonial Service ultimately being made The Queen's representative in Antigua and then Grenada, where he was Governor. Sir Ian Turbott has also served in various prominent political and academic positions in Australia culminating in his appointment as Emeritus Chancellor of the University of Western Sydney.

Sir Ian Turbott joined us for the first time last year and we hope he continues to enjoy his comradeship with fellow NZ Veterans for future marches.

As the 25<sup>th</sup> April is on a Sunday next year, the Service will be held on **Sunday 2nd May 2010** at **1030** hours. Sir Ian Turbott is our first confirmed dignitary that will be attending. However, (subject to availability and approval) we are also hoping to have as our special Guest of Honour **Cpl Willie Apiata VC**. If **Cpl Willie Apiata VC** is available we will also invite **Tpr Mark Donaldson VC**.

Therefore Veterans it would be great if you can come along and support not only ANZAC Day but also the Church who have been supporting NZ Veterans for many years and 2010 is the Church's 25th Anniversary year.

Reminder: Veteran ANZAC Day Wreath-Laying Service at the NZ Soldier Statue on ANZAC Bridge - Sunday 2 May 2010



Following on from the Church service a Wreath-Laying service will be held on the same day at 2pm in the afternoon. This year and hopefully future years the NZ Veterans are sharing this service with the Mortdale RSL Sub-Branch so that there will be a shared cost to the service. The intent is for the NZ Veterans to host in 2010 with Mortdale hosting 2011 and so on. The other

benefit is that Archdeacon Malcolm Karipa will also officiate at this service when the NZ Veterans are hosting it. The service will be held under the bridge to ensure less distraction to vehicle traffic, with the Wreath-Laying service conducted at the Statues.

There is limited room at the Statues and every effort is to be made not to hinder the general public who also have a right to visit the Statues. Nevertheless, the actual Wreath-Laying part of the service is very short. As with the service earlier in 2009 it is hoped that we will get approval from Sydney Ports Authority to use the same parking area and also RTA approval. It would be a good opportunity to see the Statue albeit whilst attending the service.

As with ANZAC Day badge selling, we also sell Poppies on Poppy Day which helps again from a revenue perspective but also in the profiling and promoting of NZ Veterans to the Australian and New



Zealand workforce in Sydney. Again this is conducted at the Martin Place station from 0630-0930 over two days followed by a breakfast. And again we will be assisted by The Sydney Maori Anglican Fellowship Church of Te Wairua Tapu.

### Change at the top for Naval Base

Commander of HMNZS PHILOMEL, Captain Fred Keating (MC09-0008-185tn).

28 January 2010

A ceremony to mark the change of Commanding Officer for the Royal New Zealand Navy base, HMNZS PHILOMEL, will be held at 10am, Friday 29 January at Devonport Naval Base.

During the ceremony Captain Dean McDougall will relinquish command of HMNZS PHILOMEL and Captain Fred Keating will assume command.

The changing of command takes place when Captain McDougall states "You have the ship" and Captain Keating replies "I have the ship".

The Change of Command Ceremony is traditionally formal and impressive – designed to strengthen the respect for authority, which is vital to any military organisation.

Captain McDougall will be greeted with a Haka Powhiri performed by the Navy Maori

Cultural Group to farewell him from the position he has held. Witnessing the ceremony will be the ship's company of HMNZS PHILOMEL, invited guests, families and friends.

Deputy Chief of Navy, Commodore Bruce Pepperell, will review the ceremony.

Biography - Captain Fred Keating

Captain Fred Keating joined the RNZN in January 1976 as a Junior Weapon Electrical Engineering Mechanic and on

completion of initial training posted to sea in HMNZS OTAGO. In 1982 Captain Keating was selected for advanced technical and professional education which was undertaken at HMNZS TAMAKI, the Auckland Institute of Technology and HMS COLLINGWOOD. Specialising in combat system engineering he subsequently returned to sea in HMNZS CANTERBURY in 1985.

Captain Keating commissioned in May 1987 and following graduation from the RNZN Officer Training School and sea service in HMNZS WELLINGTON posted to the United Kingdom to study Systems Engineering at the Royal Naval Engineering College Manadon and HMS Collingwood. On successful completion of the Weapon Engineering Application Course he returned to New Zealand in 1989 and posted to HMNZS SOUTHLAND as the Assistant Weapon and Electrical Engineer Officer (AWEO) followed by further sea service in HMNZS CANTERBURY as the Deputy Weapon and Electrical Engineer (DWEO).

From 1993 to 1995 he undertook further operational postings as the Weapon Engineer Officer (WEO) in HMNZ Ships SOUTHLAND and WAIKATO and then joined the Australian and New Zealand Anzac frigate project, leading a combined RNZN/RAN team tasked with the development, conduct and analysis of the Anzac Class Operational Test and Evaluation programme. He was the Operational Trials Officer for the Anzac First of Class trials and the introduction into naval service of HMAS ANZAC and HMNZS TE KAHA.

In 1999 Captain Keating attended and graduated from the senior staff course at the Royal New Zealand Air Force, Command and Staff College. He subsequently posted into the Maritime Headquarters where he was responsible for the planning and project management of major maintenance periods for fleet units.

In February 2001 he was promoted to Commander and assumed the post of Fleet Repair Officer with navy wide responsibility for the technical and financial management of the RNZN's repair and maintenance programmes.

From July 2003 until December 2006 Captain Keating served New Zealand in the United States of America as the Assistant Naval Attaché and Senior Technical Officer (Navy). On returning to New Zealand in January 2007 he was promoted to his present rank and assigned to Defence Headquarters in Wellington as the Assistant Chief of Navy (Capability).

Captain Keating holds a Master of Philosophy degree in Defence and Strategic Studies from Massey University.

#### WO1 Barclay receives New Year Honour

When John Barclay took on the role of Warrant Officer of the New Zealand Defence Force (NZDF) four years ago, he was entering new territory.

It was a new role both for him and the NZDF, and was established to provide an interface between the Chief of Defence Force and the NZDF's non-commissioned personnel.

The position, however, has developed into much more than that, and the effort Warrant Officer Class One Barclay has put into its development was recognised in the recent New Years Honours.

He is to become a Member of the New Zealand Order of Merit. Despite the position being new, WO 1 Barclay was eminently qualified to provide the sort of advice needed; he had spent the previous four years as Sergeant Major of the Army, a position at the apex of the Army's non commissioned ranks. He admits a touch of trepidation when he began his new job.

"I saw and recognised the wider parameters, but they were at a level I had not worked to before."

One of his earliest challenges was supporting the move to provide professional military development for Warrant Officers throughout the Services.

"It had been a bit ad hoc till then, and I experienced that personally. The NZDF had warrant officers throughout its tactical, operational and strategic environments, yet there was very little training available to prepare selected personnel for strategic level employment."

WO 1 Barclay says the NZDF Command and Staff College has provided "amazing" support, as did the Chief of Defence Force, Lieutenant General Jerry Mateparae and the senior leadership of NZDF. The leadership programme that has been developed is now being taught at the Staff College in the form of the Warrant Officer Advanced Course and Programme. In addition there has been interest in the programme by other countries

The complexity of the business the NZDF undertakes now means it needs highly trained, educated, quick-thinking, decision-making personnel at all levels.

"We have to train our non-commissioned personnel to not just "do stuff", but to think and do at the same time."

While a traditionalist in many respects, the concept of doing your job because that's the way it's been done that way for years holds no truck with him. "We need every person at every level to be a thinker. We need people to question and evaluate what they do and look for any changes that will make things better and be supported as such."

He admits such a philosophy can be risky. "And that's the challenge for us. We need to nurture, grow and use it to our advantage. If we have confidence in our personnel why wouldn't we? The NZDF is a traditional organisation, and the concept challenges the way we have traditionally done things. But if we don't challenge we will not become the best that we can be".

WO 1 Barclay has taken a keen interest in NZDF culture including the NZDF's cultural environment. He has largely contributed toward ensuring that Maori culture has the appropriate representation and through that representation defining how this contributes toward fulfilling the organisational need and mission.

### Air Force Orion locates missing boat off Kiribati

A Royal New Zealand Air Force (RNZAF) P3 Orion has successfully located a 16ft vessel missing at sea for six days in the seas off Kiribati.

The four teenagers (three females and one male) were all well but drifting approximately 50 nautical miles north west of the island of Tarawa. Their outboard motor stopped due to mechanical problems and the relieved teenagers were all waving frantically to attract the attention of the Orion crew.

The Search and Rescue mission was co-ordinated by the Rescue Coordination Centre (RCC) in Fiji who sent a request to RCC in New Zealand late Thursday evening. The Orion launched during the early hours of Friday morning and found the missing vessel just after an hour of arriving in the 11,000sq km search area.

A Patrol Boat from Tarawa was provided guidance to the location of the survivors and they were picked up at approximately 1030pm last night. The Patrol Boat with the vessel in tow were headed back to Tarawa.

"It's a great result to locate survivors in such a vast search area.

Our Orion crews are very highly trained and have significant experience in these missions, however you never really know what you're faced with until you arrive in the search area" said the Commanding Officer of No 5 Squadron, Wing Commander Nick Olney.

After a 20 hour day the Orion crew departed the search area and spent the night in Vanuatu before returning to NZ later today. Wing Commander Olney added "It's been a very busy week for No 5 Squadron with aircraft operating from the southern ocean

to north of the equator in support of Customs, Fisheries and in this case the RCC".
