HMNZS WELLINGTON ready for first visit to the capital

20 September 2010

The Offshore Patrol Vessel, HMNZS WELLINGTON, under the Command of Lieutenant Commander Simon Griffiths, will be conducting a first ever visit to her



homeport this week.

HMNZS WELLINGTON will berth at Queens Wharf, No 1, Port of Wellington at 9am on Thursday 23 September 2010.

During this historic visit WELLINGTON will be involved in a Ceremony of Welcome, she will be open to the public, her officers and crew will conduct a Charter Parade through the city's streets and host a large number of organised tours.

The Chief of Navy Rear Admiral Tony Parr, will attend the Charter Parade at 1030 Saturday 25 September 2010, where the crew of WELLINGTON will march from Queens Wharf to Civic Square. At the parade the ship will be presented the Charter to the City. This allows the ship's company the freedom to march through Wellington with swords drawn, bayonets fixed, colours flying, band playing and drums beating.

WELLINGTON will be open to the public from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm on Sunday 26 September at Queens Wharf. The Commanding Officer, Lieutenant Commander Simon Griffiths warmly invites the public of the Wellington region to tour the ship and to meet the members of the crew.

The ship will also use the visit to Wellington to launch a new association with Kimi Ora School, Thorndon. The school has been "adopted" by HMNZS WELLINGTON to build a long lasting relationship benefiting both students and crew.

The ship will depart Wellington at 5pm on Tuesday 28 September 2010.

Military hero of Battle of Long Tan remembered

Vietnam veteran and battle of Long Tan hero Morrie Stanley passed away peacefully yesterday in Auckland.

Then a Captain, Morrie was the officer in charge of an Artillery Forward Observation (FO) Party from 161 Field Battery, Royal New Zealand Artillery, during the battle of Long Tan on 18 August 1966.

His FO Party was attached to Delta Company 6 Royal Australian Infantry Regiment which engaged the Viet Cong (VC) 275 Brigade and elements of the Local Force Battalion. The party radioed in more than 60 artillery fire missions in support of the 108 Australian soldiers from D Coy.

Facing impossible odds Capt Stanley's FO Party called in accurate and devastating artillery fire to repel the estimated 2500 Vietnamese soldiers bearing down on their position.

Many, including the Long Tan veterans, current New Zealand Army personnel and military historians credit the skill, professionalism and gallantry of Morrie Stanley in keeping much of the enemy at bay. At critical points during the battle he was directing artillery to within 50 metres of the Australian front line positions.

Morrie received an MBE in 1967, and retired from the Army in 1976

In further recognition of his efforts Morrie was presented with the Australian Unit Citation (UCG) for Gallantry at a ceremony in Auckland earlier this year. In an unprecedented move, due to Morrie's failing health, both the Australian and New Zealand Governments fast tracked the offer and within a few hours of the offer being made the New Zealand Prime Minister had approved it.

Morrie will be farewelled by family, friends and servicemen in a service next week.

A Royal New Zealand Air Force (RNZAF) C-130 Hercules is currently en route to Christchurch carrying Urban Search and Rescue (USAR)

personnel and dogs.

Forty two USAR personnel, their equipment and three USAR dogs from the Auckland and Palmerston North areas are on board. The aircraft is due to land at Christchurch airport shortly. Two Iroquois helicopters from No. 3 Squadron at Ohakea have also been tasked to assist in Christchurch. They will be available to undertake aerial reconnaissance and damage assessment as required by Civil Defence.

Due to potential contamination of the fuel at Christchurch airport, a RNZAF fuel tanker is heading from Ohakea to Christchurch to supply the RNZAF aircraft.
