### Reminder: ANZAC Day - Sunday 25th April 2010


ANZAC Day in 2010 will more than likely be the same format as this and previous years. However, just to clarify, the term 'veteran' in today's context refers to all serving and ex-service personnel not just those



that served overseas. So whether you have a medal or not, as long as you served in the military you are considered a veteran and I would be very privileged to march alongside you at ANZAC Day every year. Furthermore, I will be more 'pushy' this year so please form up early, be smartly dressed and stand proudly in your ranks and files. The ANZAC Day March structure is shown below.

The vehicle has been placed at the rear of the marchers due to the exhaust fumes causing problems in previous years and VVVII veterans (declining in numbers) are to be given pride of place at the front.

Also please note that Sir Ian Turbott AO CMG CVO Hon.D.Litt (UWS) NZ World War II Veteran has accepted our offer to be the Parade Commander.

Reminder: Veteran ANZAC Day Wreath-Laying Service at the NZ Soldier Statue on ANZAC Bridge - Sunday 2 May 2010

Following on from the Church service a Wreath-Laying service will be held on the same day at 2pm in the afternoon. This year and hopefully future years the NZ Veterans are sharing this service with the Mortdale RSL Sub-Branch so that there will be a shared cost to the service. The intent is for the NZ Veterans to host in 2010 with Mortdale hosting 2011 and so on. The other benefit is that Archdeacon Malcolm Karipa will also officiate at this service when the NZ Veterans are hosting it. The service will be held under the bridge to ensure less

Dear Australia based Veterans: I am currently developing a Website for us all called the **New Zealand Veterans in Australia** www.nzvia.com.au (please note all hyperlinks are not active but give a general understanding of the future website and email structure)



The purpose of the website is to simply have a central place albeit on the Internet, for us to submit our news, articles and information regarding NZ Veterans in Australia. Separate pages have been developed for each of the States with the emphasis on information pertaining primarily to NZ Veterans in your States. Although there will be a Current News page(s) which will contain information about NZ Veterans in general either AU or NZ including RNZRSA news, NZDF news, VANZ etc.

There is **no funding** either directly or indirectly for NZVIA and therefore the supporting positions are all Honorary (voluntary) including the Honorary President <u>president@nzvia.com.au</u>, Honorary Vice President <u>vicepresident@nzcia.com.au</u>, Honorary Secretary <u>secretary@nzvia.com.au</u>.

This is a work in progress and I do want to make it clear that because the NZVIA is voluntary and there is no funding, all correspondence will be by email only as there are no resources available to manage the organisation any other way e.g. postal mail etc.

Please also be patient and understanding when providing information you would like updated on the website (once it goes live) as websites take a lot of work to maintain and as with most of us, the demands of work and other life commitments can place high demands on a voluntary organisation like NZVIA.

Although it would be nice if we had a Logo as I personally would be very proud to wear a Pocket with a Logo and the words **New Zealand Veteran**. I prefer this to New Zealand Veteran in Australia because I can wear it anywhere and everywhere I go (other countries). However, I am certainly open to suggestions.



### 543332 Private Joseph Charles RIRI



Joe was born on the 5th May 1945 in Opotiki and at the age of 21 joined the NZ Army on the 7th December 1966. After a further six years of loyal and dedicated service to the NZ Defence Force, Joe was discharged from the NZ Army on the 4th July 1972.

Six years may not seem like a long time in the NZ Army, but in that time, Joe served

two tours in Vietnam firstly with Victor 3 and then a second tour with Victor 6, tours that must have seemed like a lifetime of service to Joe at a time when NZ entered what became NZs longest and most controversial war in June of 1964.

Joe along with his fellow Victor 3 comrades arrived in Vietnam in May of 1968 and left in May 1969. At some time during Victor 3 tour, the NZ force only numbered 543. 37 died while on active service and 187 were wounded. For Joe, knowing that 37 of his fellow comrades died would have been devastating. Yet because of his sense of loyalty and his personal commitment to the welfare and safety of his fellow comrades, Joe went back to Vietnam with Victor 6 in May 1971 until Victor 6 and Joe left Vietnam in December 1971.

Joe passed away on 21 November 2009 and his service was held on Tuesday 2 December 2009. Joe's service was attended by a number of Veterans not only from NSW but also from Western Australia and Queensland which was not only great that they could attend and farewell our own fellow Veteran, but also great to meet Veterans from interstate.

Joe was lying in an open coffin draped with the NZ Flag, Korowai and Lemon Squeezer along with his Medals. Neville Berridge conducted the NZ Veteran Service formal proceedings and Greg Makutu on behalf of Taawhi Kerehona and the other Vietnam Veterans in attendance gave the service Eulogy. Taawhi was going to give the Eulogy but at the time, the emotion of losing a comrade was too much. To the Vietnam Veterans that attended, thank you for the privilege and honour to represent you on behalf of your fellow Vietnam Veteran Joe Riri. To Hank on behalf of all Vietnam Veterans in NZ, thank you for your messages of condolence and eulogy.
