#### **Business Arisina:**

1.0 The Christchurch contingent were concerned at the removal of John Suttie from the position of Treasurer. The National Secretary asked how any other reaction could result when only two letters had been read out by John of the several written. If they had have heard the lot of the letters - and the background to the letters - they may have formed a different opinion. The Secretary undertook to send the full file of letters to the Branch. In spite of many promises and urgings from the Executive, the audited statements were not in the offing.

The Ministry of Economic Development had threatened to remove the Association from the Register of Incorporated Societies because of the lack of audited statements of accounts. This would then open the Association to investigation and scrutiny by the Inland Revenue Department and could cost the Association thousands of dollars as we could become responsible for paying taxes on monies collected over many years back and the IRD are not restricted by the Statute of Limitations.

(A foot note: Fred Watts had asked that they be sent to him, and that John had asked him yesterday not to raise the question in the meeting. Muka had asked that they be sent to him as he was the Branch Secretary. The National Secretary undertook to send BOTH members copies. The President failed to mention that the books and records were in such a state that two Chartered Accountants would not have been able to sort things out without charging the Association BIG bucks, so it was decided that Russ Byrne would voluntarily assume the role of interim Treasurer and do the best he could to bring the books up to the best standard he was able.)

2.0 The exercise of presenting the Remit on behalf of the Malayan Police Field Force was endorsed, but reservations were expressed by some members against the likelihood of a positive outcome, as the people involved were not sworn members of a military force - Army, Navy or Air Force.

# 8.0 FINANCIAL STATEMENT:

Russell Byrne reported verbally. He was sorting through the heaps of paper from John Suttie. It was a massive job and not simple to complete. No book-keeping records or accounting system is available. He was beginning to create a Book - keeping Journal in order to bring some order to the portfolio, but was more concerned with the Tour of Memories.

He reported that the trading (cheque) account showed an amount of from an enquiry from the bank.

He was not aware of the Investment Accounts and how much was in each.

The National Secretary reported that a bequest from the Gordon Passau Estate totalled \$5 000. Approximately \$200+ had accumulated in interest.

The National Secretary also reported on the \$20 000 Investment which was money from the Bank. Approximately \$2000+ had been earned in interest. The National President expanded on this by explaining the initial fund was a residue from the Graham Hall investment, on which we had lost money to start with.

(Footnote: The current National Secretary copies the bank statements and Investment Certificates and sends them to each member of the National Executive. However, the latest statements had not been sent in time for this meeting. Therefore Russell was unable to be more accurate.)

A discussion took place about the understanding that the accumulated funds from the \$200 Paid Life Member pool. The National Secretary suggests that Sid Maguire had to break the fund because the trading account had gotten so low. This provoked a heated discussion during which it was strongly stated that the total was to have remained intact, and only the interest earned was to be used.

(Footnote: This may have been the understanding when the original undertaking was employed, but the current National Secretary recalls a statement made that indicated that the Association was at Insolvency level when Sid was "forced" to break into the fund. There is no longer a record of any other Investment Account other than the two mentioned above.)

#### 10.0 REMITS:

The Meeting considered FIVE particular REMITS as listed below. The results and some reasons are also listed. The REMITS agreed by the meeting will appear on the Agenda of the Biennial General Meeting 2007 and be considered by the membership and adopted if so wished.

#### REMIT 1.0

"That the following clause be added to the section of the CONSTITUTION. 2.

#### **OBJECTS:**

(E) To form a Widows, Wives and Families Section as a support group for the with reciprocal support for Widows, wives and families.

The National Secretary presented the REMIT on behalf of the National Executive.

Discussion ranged from the ability of widows and wives to become Associate members if they were offered the position, and likening the group to the 28 Maori Battalion support group which had become "bloody dangerous in the Whangarei area" according to Bill Mayor!

On the show of hands, REMIT One was LOST.

REMIT 2.0 "That the following clause be added to the section of the CONSTITUTION

(F) To care for the health and welfare of the members of the Association.

The National Secretary presented the REMIT on behalf of the National Executive. Discussion ranged from the definition of what welfare meant and how it could be applied .. The members found difficulty in divorcing themselves and their thinking from what the RSA does, even though they were urged to apply the principle of the

health and welfare being the state of how healthy the Association is, and how that transposes to its membership. The members were urged to think of health of the membership in terms of upgrading personal skills and knowledge ..

Motion: That the REMIT be amended to read:

To care for the health and wellbeing of the members of the Association.

Bill Mayor reminded the meeting that the REMIT would be renumbered as (E) prior to presentation at the Biennial General Meeting.

MALAYA, BORNEO & SINGAPORE VETERANS ASSOCIATION (Inc) New Zealand.

The National Secretary presented on behalf of the National Executive. Discussion ranged widely.

The results had lead to a Business Plan and the Diagram Of Responsibilities. The National Secretary attempted to explain what the Responsibilities involved and the need for those coming on Board to accept they will be given portfolios and the chance to create a small locally based support group.

It was resolved that sub - paragraphs 6 & 7 A would be rewritten.

REMIT 5.0 That the Paid Life Member category of membership be rescinded and be replaced by a Twelve Year Decade Member category.

The National Secretary opened discussion citing himself as an example of having had ten years without paying any subscription fee, but enjoying the rights and privileges of membership since the time when his Annual Membership equivalent ended. In fact the Association was left to operate on the lessening subscriptions of Annual Members. Over 1500 members had paid the Paid Life Member subscription, after which no funding could be expected from this group.

The Twelve Year Decade Member would still pay the lump sum, which would be equivalent to a ten year subscription. However, as a bonus, the Twelve Year Decade Member would be granted two years free membership. Thereafter, the member could revert to Annual Membership, or take up another Twelve Year Decade subscription. The new charge would not apply until after the Biennial General Election of 2007, should it be accepted by members.

#### 12.0 GENERAL BUSINESS;

The President asked each person around the table for any General Business:

(Northland) Bill was concerned at talk about "our branch" instead of "OUR ASSOCIATION".

He was also concerned to see members wearing KEV badges, as we never fought for it.

Bill Mayor: Victor Aubrey: (Manurewa) Asked how ma

Asked how many present members served after 1965. He expressed a

point of

view that all those who were present except for two, were "old". He was concemed at the age. Victor maintained that present members had only old ideas, and couldn't relate to the younger members. What the Association needed was younger members to bring new ideas to the meetings. The National Secretary stated he felt offended by the statement as it inferred that he and others had no brains. Victor went on to say he would have been the youngest there if Paul Reddish (Waikato - Ngaruawahia) had not been there.

(Footnote: The member was not in possession of the new system Diagram of Responsibilities to make the statement about no new ideas coming in. Nor was the member aware that many of the people present were part of the historical makeup of the Association, and indeed were responsible for many - if not all - of the items members currently enjoy. In that respect the National Secretary was offended by Victor's statements and the insensitive nature and lack of background knowledge inherent in the comments tabled.)

Brian Frost: (Wanganui) To safeguard the name and integrity of the Association, Wanganui was suggesting the Association TRADEMARK the name. It would cost \$250 initially, but could save the Association lots if it found itself in a similar situation to that when the Wanganui and Wnangarei chapters broke away. That the National Executive investigate the possibility and present a Recommendation: recommendation to the BGM. Aiden Donner: (Rotorua) He was pleased that he had been able to refer to an article printed by the National Secretary in a copy of Selamat which answered the age old questions - why should I join the Association? What's in it for me? He thanked the National Secretary for the article. Ray Morrissey: (Waikato) Related having spoken to the President of the Taradale RSA who was curious about a display sign left at Taradale RSA following a National Reunion. It was explained that the Reunion was advertised for Napier, but was held at Taradale. (Secretary note: Napier RSA was rebuilding at the time) The Napier Branch presented the display sign to Taradale Branch, so it is the property of Taradale RSA. Theo Brunt: (Manu rewa) "Invites all members to the 2009 National Reunion to be held at Manurewa RSA. Russell Byrne: (National Executive) Nominated Walter Netto, a Malaysian Citizen with permanent residency in New Zealand, as an HONORARY MEMBER of the ASSOCIATION in accordance with Paragraph 3D of the CONSTITUTION.
